We are absolutely thrilled to learn that Old Palace has been included in The Cricketer Magazine's Top 20 All-Girls Schools for Cricket. We are very proud of both our Old Palace PE department, under Director of Sport, Mrs Smith, and our students, for this well-deserved accolade.

Mrs Smith says:

"Inclusion in The Cricketer Magazine's Top 20 All-Girls section highlights Old Palace's achievements so far and affirms the plans we have for the future to take cricket to the next level. We are very proud to have been recognised for our efforts in developing sporting opportunities for our students."

Women's cricket is a fast growing and developing sport in the UK. The Old Palace PE Department has worked hard to develop cricket within the school; both in the curriculum and the extracurricular programme.

This is the first time that The Cricketer has featured a Top 20 All-Girls Schools category in their prestigious Schools Guide, alongside their usual Top 100 Senior Schools and Top 50 Prep Schools.

It follows an exhaustive process which saw a record number of schools submit entries to be included in the Guide, despite the ongoing pandemic.



All entries were judged against an extensive set of criteria, which included a compelling commitment to cricket in the curriculum, facilities, fixture programmes and coaching.

The Cricketer gathered entries and compiled the leading lists, working alongside former England star Lydia Greenway to select the inaugural top 20 all-girls schools.

The Cricketer magazine editor, Simon Hughes, said: "This year's Schools Guide is particularly important in showcasing schools who have kept the game alive through a very challenging

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summer. Whether it has been remote video sessions, drills in the garden or even Zoom quizzes, school's cricket has emerged resolutely from this pandemic and the appetite to get back out on the playing fields is palpable.

There should be deserved praise for all the teachers, coaches and volunteers who have put in so much hard work, in the most difficult of circumstances, to preserve a love of the game among the next generation."

Prep News: Hanukkah & Human Rights Day

On Thursday, 10th December, we will be learning about the Jewish festival of Hanukkah and about International Human Rights Day.

As well as learning about Hanukkah and how it is celebrated, Early Years and Key Stage 1 girls will be making a menorah picture whilst Key Stage 2 girls will play Spin the Dreidel.





We will also be celebrating International Human Rights Day.

In Circle Time, girls will be learning about what their human rights are and will be given the opportunity to take part in a discussion.

Royal Society's Young People's Book Prize 2020



The Royal Society Young People's Book Prize aims to inspire young people to read about science and promotes the writing of excellent, accessible STEM books for under-14s. The prize is unique in that the winner of this prize (from the oldest continuous scientific establishment in the world) has a shortlist selected by five adult judges (including Waterstones Children's Laureate, How to Train Your Dragon author Cressida Cowell and TV presenter and author Konnie Hug). However, final judging to decide the winner comes from the feedback of 500+ schools and youth groups across the UK who act as 'judges'. This year, one of these groups includes our Year 6 students.

Judging requires specific skills, with votes for the shortlisted books being cast against four specific criteria based on: *Ease of Reading, Layout, Interest* and *Overall Appeal*. Students scored these categories and marks were tallied to discover our overall winner.

The six books shortlisted cover a range of STEM topics; from how one-click shopping works, tips on thinking like a Nobel Prize winning scientist, astrophysics and a verse story about friendship using coding.

The shortlisted books for 2020 are:

Astrophysics for Young People in a Hurry by Neil deGrasse Tyson

Cats React to Science Facts by Izzi Howell

Gut Garden by Katie Brosnan

How to Win a Nobel Prize by Barry Marshall

In the Key of Code by Aimee Lucido *The Everyday Journeys of Ordinary Things* by Libby Deutsh Being National Non-Fiction November, we discussed what makes a good nonfiction book, how non-fiction books are created to allow facts to be easily understood using a combination of pictures, illustration and text.

The book Year 6 will be putting forward to the Royal Society as their winning book is:

Trinity Schools Book Award 2021

Shadowing book awards are a great way of experiencing a diverse range of subjects, authors, writing and illustration styles through reading, which helps boost imagination, creativity, knowledge, discussion and empathy.

Library Seniors is involved with many local and national book awards, allowing Old Palace students the chance to read, review and reflect on a range of exciting new books.

From October to February, Year 7-11 students can take part in the Trinity Schools Book Awards. The shortlisted books this year are based around the theme Only Human. Students have the opportunity to read, review and take part in competitions alongside 30 other schools (including Trinity and Whitgift) in South East England.

TSBA Book Club will take place during Year 7-11 allocated library lunch time sessions.

CILIP Carnegie and Kate Greenaway Awards 2021

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From March until June 2021, students will be able to take part in shadowing one of the oldest and most prestigious children's book awards in the world, CILIP's Carnegie and Kate Greenaway Children's Book Awards. Since the beginning of November, Old Palace has a more personal connection to this award. For the next two years, our school librarian Mrs Chevalier will be one of the 15 national judges. She is currently reading all 152 nominated books, reducing it down to a longlist, then shortlist. It is the Carnegie Award shortlist that we will be reading as part of our Old Palace Shadowing group from March 2021.

More information on being part of the Old Palace Carnegie Shadowing Group will be given next year.

Our grateful thanks to the OPA committee for their generous assistance in the filming of this Service.












Anne Boleyn Portrait

Nuryia said 'We used our fingers to blend the colours and a white pastel to make it look as if light was shining on the fruit!'


















Year 2: Charlotte's Web
