

Engineering Development Trust Industrial Cadet Gold Award





Four A-level Physics students in Year 12 have just embarked on a 12 week project with the Engineering Development Trust www.etrust.org.uk/about-us

The project focuses on a real-life STEM challenge, with the support of a Mentor from a partnered company and a teacher, whilst the students develop key skills, such as problem solving, teamwork, careers awareness, personal development, required to meet the Industrial Cadets Gold level accreditation.

Following on from some problem solving activities at the launch event on 20th November, the students were introduced to their Mentor Andrew, from PCS Instruments, the company who had offered to be the industrial partner for Old Palace School on the project. Andrew is a Research Engineer at PCS Instruments and a qualified Mechanical Engineer with a Master of Engineering (MEng) from Newcastle University, specialising in machine design.

After the launch the team met with their Mentor virtually and discussed their ideas from a group of suggested projects the employer could offer support with:

- Intelligent recycling
- Air Pollution Monitoring and Reduction
- Sustainable Energy Generation
- Bird Deterrent


They had ideas for the first three and Andrew offered a suggestion for the 4th option. They discussed the feasibility of all their ideas with Andrew and between the group they chose to move forward with idea 3-Sustainable Energy Generation.

PCS Instruments is committed to reducing our impact on the environment and investigating that impact where possible. This project allows the team to choose their main focus in this area of green projects, which will be supported by the team at PCS.

The team now have to develop their ideas further to incorporate sustainable energy generation into the design of their product. We look forward to seeing their ideas in a future bulletin.
