#### Year 10: GCSE Science Live!





Last December, a group of Year 10 students attended the GCSE Science Live! lectures, where we heard scientists talk about their various areas of interest:

Talks included: Space travel and Supernovas (by Dr Maggie Aderin-Pocock), ancient burial sites, and how to tell age, causes of injuries, sex and height from looking at a skeleton (Professor Alice Roberts) and Time travel (with Professor Jim Al-Khalili). It was interesting to learn that both Time travel into the future and the past are possible but restricted by technology. The Chief Examiner taught us how to



answer GCSE examination questions and focused on command words, which was very helpful. Professor Andrea Sella answered the question 'how did the zebra get its stripes?' and did many demonstrations, which was very exciting. Many of us found Professor Lord Robert Winston's talk the most interesting. He explored IVF, and we got to watch the first cells of now-adults multiply, which was amazing!

We loved visiting Science Live! It was a very academic and exceptional tour of Science which we felt extremely lucky to have experienced. All the speakers caught our attention as we discovered the different aspects of Science.
















#### Prep: Celebrating Martin Luther King Jr Day

#### Years 3-6: UK Power Networks Workshops

On Tuesday, pupils in Years 3-6 took part in two extremely valuable and potentially life-saving workshops on how to stay safe around electricity.

Safety advisors from UK Power Networks, which distributes electricity across the South East, visited Prep to highlight the importance of the power network and the dangers of high voltage electricity. Ros Forbes, the safety advisor who visited Old Palace, said: "Our safety sessions open children's eyes to the wonders of electricity, while alerting them to the potential hazards to help them stay safe around electricity throughout their lives. We discuss why electricity is so important and how it gets to our schools and homes through overhead and underground cables.



We talk about the risks that come with electricity and the kind of hazards they might encounter during recreational activities.

We also show children how to identify our equipment, discuss what the yellow Danger of Death sign means and why they should ring us on 105 if they ever spot a hazard on the electricity network, such as a power line brought down in a storm. We also get them to make an electrical circuit to show how electricity works and we take along our safety clothing, to try on and talk about the different jobs in the industry, which might interest them in the future."

Year 10 CCF cadets began their NCO training this weekend, participating in a course at Whitgift School.



#### The National Cipher Challenge



#### Year 10


Recently in lessons, we have been doing The National Cipher Challenge. This competition involves a lot of schools from around the world. You have to solve a code in order to figure out the original messages that were sent.

Part A is always slightly easier than Part B in order to warm us up for the true challenge. We use a range of different techniques to assist us in solving the encoded message.

Year 10 and Year 12 have been taking part, and we have all been enjoying it thoroughly, and have been very engaged in the competition. So far we have been challenged with figuring out how to solve the codes. Several people, including ourselves, have been encouraged to research other paths into cyber safety and cryptography due to these complex encryptions.

Currently, we are joint first. We are excited to get started on the next challenge and to see how we are placed overall. Most of all, we are looking forward to the final challenge, and the difficulties that will come with it.

#### Year 12


During our A Level Computer Science lessons we have been working on The Cipher Challenge. This is a national Cryptography competition, held by Southampton University. This year's theme is called 'The Empty Vault'. It allows you to compete against different schools, and people working independently. The competition is split up into challenges A and B, with there being 10 challenges in total. It starts with simple encrypted messages to crack, making you believe that the entire competition will be a smooth ride. Although the difficulty does increase, apart from the unique storyline it follows, this is part of what makes the competition worth it.

Entering this competition was a steep learning curve. This is because we had learnt a multitude of ciphers so we could participate, such as the Vigenère cipher, Hill cipher, and different variations of a Transposition cipher. I will be explaining the Vigenère cipher, a type of substitution cipher. Encrypting text can be done with a Vigenère square, or Vigenère table. This could be a table of different alphabets written out twenty-six

times, shifted to the left, above or beside the previous alphabet. This may sound complicated, but to make this simpler, you could create a program to do this for you. Up until halfway through the challenge, we had little knowledge of how much of this could help in terms of possible career choices. This includes working in military, national, and cybersecurity systems, and more.

For every challenge that we've completed, we have managed to place 1st on the individual leader boards. The scoring system uses accuracy and speed to determine where people will be placed on them. The system will then take these results, and use them to create the final leader board for the overall challenge. Our fast progress was good news for us because it meant that we were making tremendous progress, even though we were relatively new to this concept. I would definitely recommend entering this competition, especially if you take an interest in solving complicated problems, maths, or computer science. So far, we are placed joint first out of hundreds of teams nationally.
