

Last week, Year 12 Physicists visited Gatwick Airport.

They enjoyed a very constructive day exploring restricted areas of the airport and looking at different engineering departments ranging from Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning to Baggage and the Shuttle.

They also enjoyed a talk from a pilot and CAE staff about routes to becoming a pilot – which triggered interest amongst the students to explore this career path.



Before visiting Gatwick, I was completely unaware about the spectrum of physics-based jobs you could get in Aviation. I honestly did not expect myself to be as interested in piloting as I am now. During the trip, our tour guide took us through many 'behind the scenes' areas of Gatwick where people worked on different maintenance jobs in the airport such as luggage, aircraft heating and engineering of the shuttles. It was inspiring to see how much work the engineers put into such commodities in order to ensure everyone's comfort.

The most useful thing I can take away from this experience is the introduction to commercial piloting. EasyJet's program includes a two-year programme, where you will be trained to become a pilot, and you won't even require a degree!
