


AROUND THE PALACE

Year 7 - Creatures

Year 7 have been working on their theme of 'Creatures' throughout the year.

They have experimented with a variety of media and have recently completed highly detailed paintings.

Their final project introduces them to print making and also the art of Notan – a paper cutting technique.

We look forward to seeing their finished pieces!





Year 8 - Ceramics

Year 8 are following the theme of 'Identity' this year. They have produced cubist collages, sustained drawings and silk paintings to name a few. They have most recently completed a ceramics project where they have designed exaggerated, emotive faces. This task has allowed them to learn a range of techniques using clay such as; pinch pots, coiling, applying and incising.





Year 9 - Textiles

The theme for Year 9 has been 'Layers'. Students have explored this theme in a variety of ways; observational drawing, collage, mixed media, ceramics and collaborative work.

Their textile project has been really exciting as they have used a number of methods to create a layered fabric

design. Students began by painting or dying their fabric and then created a print to go on top of this. The printing techniques varied from screen printing, mono printing, stena and foam printing.

Year 9 finished their designs by embellishing them using sewing techniques and applying buttons and beads to add extra detail. The results were fantastic and really individual.

We were delighted to welcome Taiyeba and Jumana as guest speakers at our Senior Prizegiving yesterday.



The evening was certainly a celebration of student achievement and beautiful musical talent.










CCF Range Day

Year 12 Economics Students Enjoy Talk From OPA Stefani Williams

Stefani Williams, a former pupil of Old Palace, visited Year 12 Economists to talk about pursuing a career in the Finance sector, particularly for women. She discussed how studying A Level Economics inspired her to complete a degree in the subject, and that even today Economics is still a very male dominated degree, with only 25% of Economics university students being female.

She then spoke about how this led her to a career in finance. Stefani is a Chartered Financial planner at Holden & Partners, which involves working with clients to manage their wealth and plan for their future (e.g., retirement planning or tax-efficient investing). She spoke about how connecting with her clients on a personal basis and promoting sustainable and ethical investment were some of her favourite aspects of her job.

Overall, Stefani's talk was very informative and thoughtprovoking, especially when she encouraged us to feel empowered rather than intimidated when entering a male-dominated setting at any point during our future career. She also motivated more of our Economics class to consider a potential career in finance, so I think I can speak on behalf of my class when I say it was a very enjoyable and useful talk.



On July 4, 1954, meat and all other food rationing finally ended in the UK. Rationing had been in place for fourteen years since 1940, when it had been introduced early in World War II. A typical weekly adult ration had included 4oz Bacon or Ham, 2oz cheese, 2oz butter, 8oz sugar and 1 egg!

The night was also filled with entertaining and moving theatrical extracts. The first was an extract from *Annie the Musical*. Students rose to the challenge of portraying these classic characters and the choreography performed by the Year 7 dance ensemble in *Hard Knock Life* was to a very high standard. Despite this being a challenging undertaking, the students performed with such maturity and passion, the audience were certainly entertained! Other performances included an extract from *The Wolves* by Sarah DeLappe;

a thought provoking and exciting piece about young girls in an American soccer team. The actors in this piece astounded the audience with their ability to perform with such emotional maturity whilst using an unfamiliar style. The actors also impressed the audience with their profoundly moving and empowering performance of *The Greek Women*, a story of powerful females in Greek theatre and literature who were finally given a voice.

The dancers of Old Palace also performed with grace and fluidity in *The Waiting Room*. This piece told the story of four patients, whose spirits depart from this world and enter into a new realm; the afterlife. The audience were immersed in the emotions and beauty of this piece, and cherished its message of love and life. The night ended with a collaborative and spirit-raising performance of *Blinded by Your Grace, Pt. 2* by Stormzy which filled the performance space with love and light.
